# **Complaints:**

1335 Oak Tree Road Responded to a second alarm activation on arrival found the same conditions as previously encountered. Fire Alarm activated and no one evacuated. This time someone reset the alarm system prior to the arrival of the Fire Department. A nothing violation and penalty was instituted immediately.

# **Investigations:**

Fire Prevention Bureau was requested to respond to a smoke condition situation at 47 Leslie Road, on arrival met by Chief Philips and explained that a lamp shade had come in contact with a light bulb and a smoldering fire occurred. The resident, Helen Somers, never explained or admitted what happened. Investigation reveled that clothing, a bra and other clothing, had been placed on top of the Lamp Shade and caused a smoldering fire, but the resident, removed the clothing but did not share this with her family or the emergency responders. After the situation was clarified a discussion was had with the residents' family members present who monitor her and live within a close area and who would make sure the resident understood the danger to herself, her family members and the responders. The daughter, Kathleen Curcio of 3 Annett Lane, said she would.
